Scientific Linux CERN 4 (SLC4) end of life...

End of general user support at the

End of December 2010.

- User requests for SLC4 support and/or installation will be rejected by service desk after that date.
- Dedicated support for experiments and accelerator controls is maintained.
 - For three months after 2011 LHC shutdown beginning.
 - No longer than February 2012.
 - Requested by Atlas Online, CMS Online, Alice Online and BE/CO.





Scientific Linux CERN 4 (SLC4) end of life ... a reminder.



- You still have, according to statistics:
 - Over 1000 SLC 4 (non-CC) systems running.
 - Out of **3400** active.
 - Down from **1600** in June 2010.
- Only 3 months left
 - Please, consider migrating to SLC5 now.
 - Computer Center migration is almost finished:
 - **900** SLC4 systems.
 - 6500 SLC5 systems.





Scientific Linux CERN 6 (SLC6)



- Not available yet
 - We are still waiting for Red Hat to release Red Hat Enterprise Linux 6
 - Latest (unconfirmed) rumors say RHEL6 will arrive in **December 2010**.
 - We have **Beta** version available for installs.
- Once RHEL6 becomes available
 - We will need a month to release a first, preview version of SLC6.
 - We will need few months to incorporate all changes/fixes before we release a certified SLC6 version – in Spring 2011 ?
- Do not wait for SLC6 to migrate from SLC4.
